Starting my master's degree at the beginning of my second year of teaching was a no-brainer for me. I told myself, "Don't take too much time off, you'll lose momentum." There was also the tiny voice in my head reminding me, "You'll get a pay raise soon if you get going with that next degree!" While wrapping up my first year of teaching in June, I was also accepted into the Masters of Arts in Education (MAED) program. I began setting myself up for a busy 18 months ahead of me, planning to finish my program as soon as possible. In my Initial Goal Statement, I initiated the the idea of focusing my masters in literacy to help my kindergartners be as successful as possible in the short year they were with me. I did not research enough, and did not know that I could get a specific literacy endorsement along with my masters.
